Introduction

My name is _____ and I am a ____ year pupil from _____. Thank Fr. _____ for allowing me to speak to you all today to mark Catholic Education Week. The theme for this year's Catholic Education Week is inspired by Pope Francis' reflection on the Opening of Synodal Path. The Holy Father said that:

"Nothing leaves Jesus indifferent; everything is of concern to him. Encountering faces, meeting eyes, sharing history. That is the closeness that Jesus embodies. He knows that someone's life can be changed by a single encounter. The Gospel is full of such encounters with Christ, encounters that uplift and bring healing. Jesus did not hurry along or keep looking at his watch to get the meeting over. He was always at the service of the person he was with, listening to what he or she had to say. "

Our school community is witness to the Gospel in many ways:

- Learning is shaped using Gospel values, so that we learn to use our gifts and talents to be better versions of ourselves.
- We join in prayer every morning, and remember our Church, spread throughout the world.
- Our school promotes social justice so that the mission of the Church is heard by all.
- The school vision is to educate the whole person- body, mind and soul - so that we may be confident in our response to God's call.
- Our school is a place of worship and celebration and is an opportunity for all to encounter Christ.



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Distinctive Nature of Catholic Schools

Points to consider:

- Our Catholic schools are communities where Jesus is the 'driving force' behind the school's planning and actions.

What have we learned this year from Jesus' teachings?

- We are communities of faith and learning.

How does our school engage with our faith community?

- Work with homes and parishes to provide a rounded, holistic education and system of support for young people's physical, intellectual, social, emotional and spiritual well-being and development.

What extra-curricular activities does our school offer?

- Catholic schools in Scotland are inclusive communities.

How does our school observe celebrations of other world religions?



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Communion, Participation, Mission

Points to consider:

- Pentecost this year not only marked the birth of the Church, but also renewed our Call to Communion as the Sunday Mass obligation was restored.
- The doors of our churches were closed for many, but the Gospel was kept alive in our schools, and in our homes.

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What does this mean for our school?

Points to consider:

- Our school(s) work together with our parishes to give our children the best opportunities possible to grow in love of God and with each other. Here are some of the examples of the ways in which our schools and parish work together as a community of faith and learning living in the example of Jesus:
